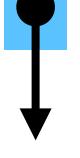

More than 90% of the objects in museums around the world will never be seen by the public — lack of display space or damage or fragility.

- Making the visible accessible.

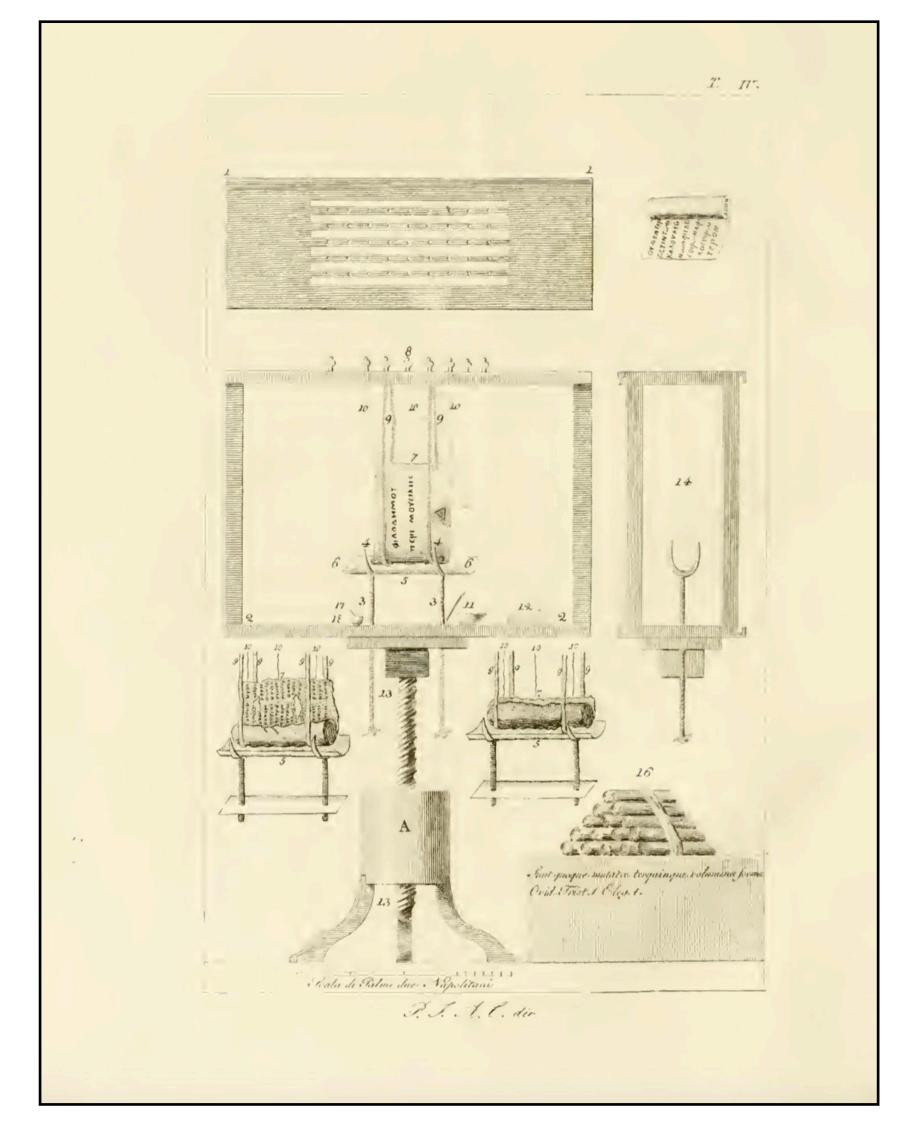


Destructive Attempts

In the 18th century, scrolls were unwrapped at the rate of a centimeter an hour, using a machine designed by Vatican conservator Antonio Piaggio.

Hundreds of scrolls were pulled apart using Piaggio's machine, but they revealed only limited text.

Destructive Attempts

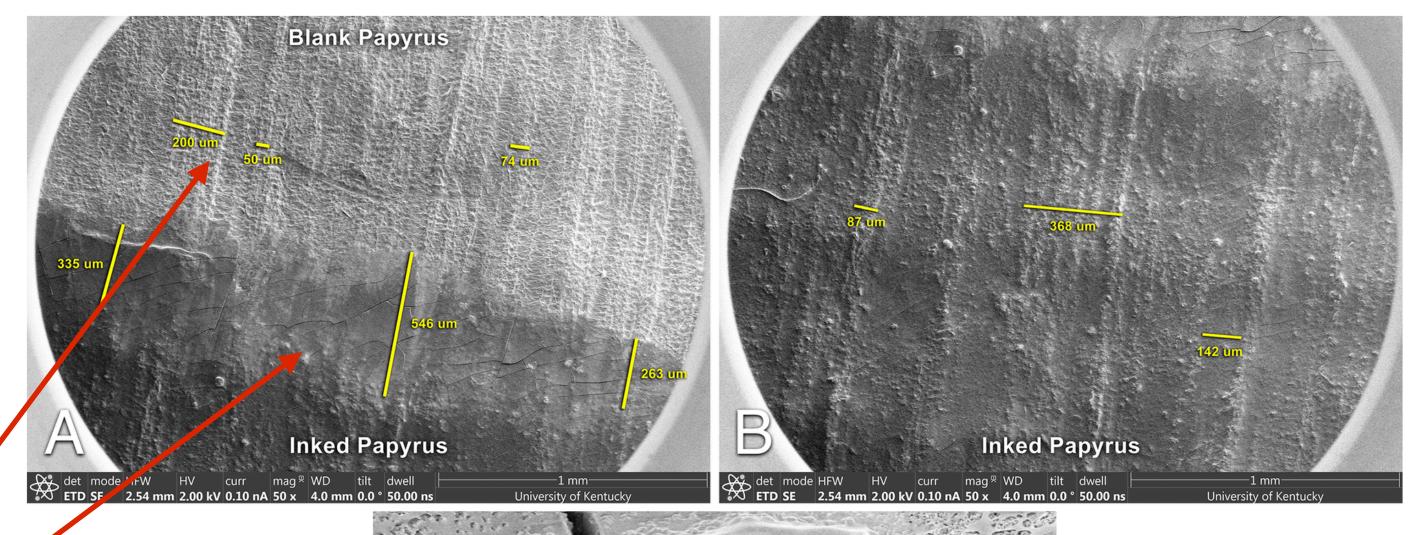
The most successful attempts were made in the 19th century, when about 300 of them were peeled apart by machine.

• This endeavor resulted in fragmented, layered sheets of brittle papyrus with visible, but largely illegible, writing on the black-as-charcoal surface.



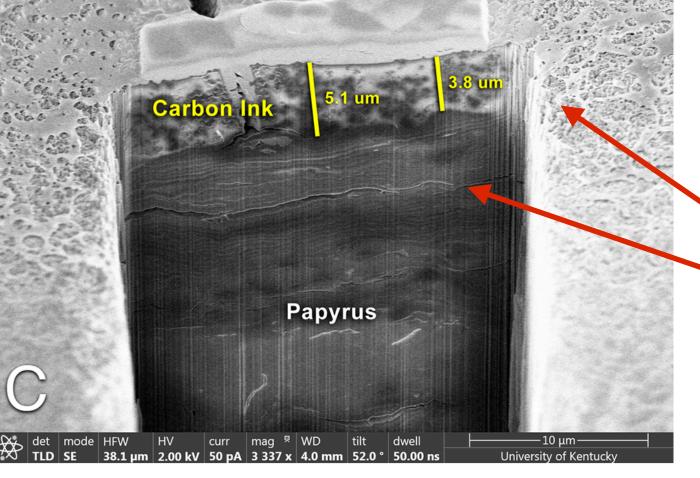

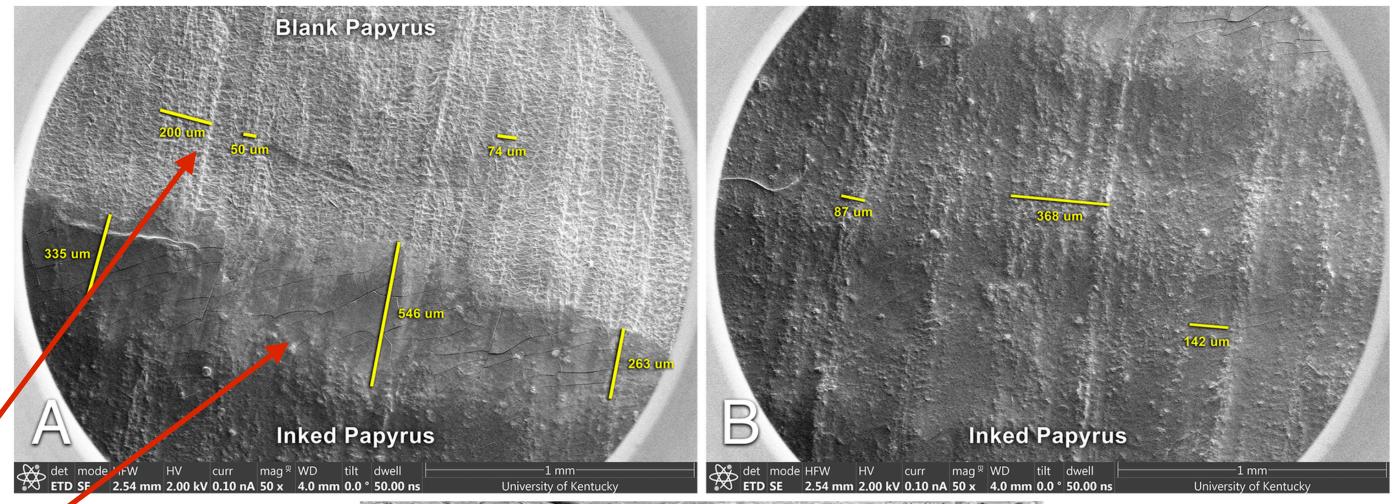

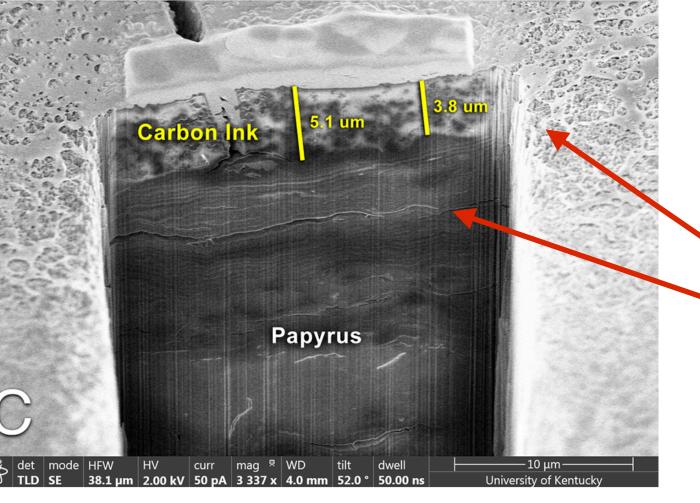


Intensity difference (not always significant: carbon ink vs. papyrus)

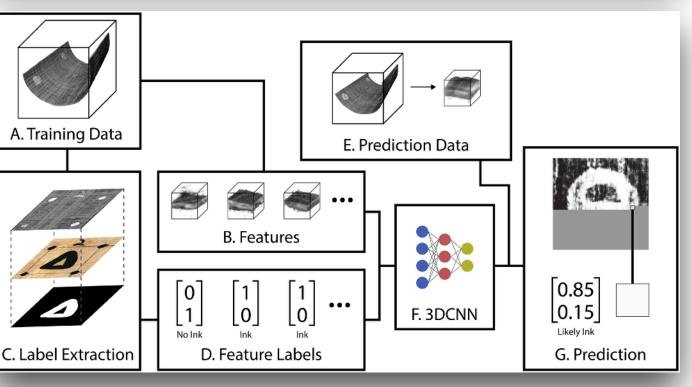

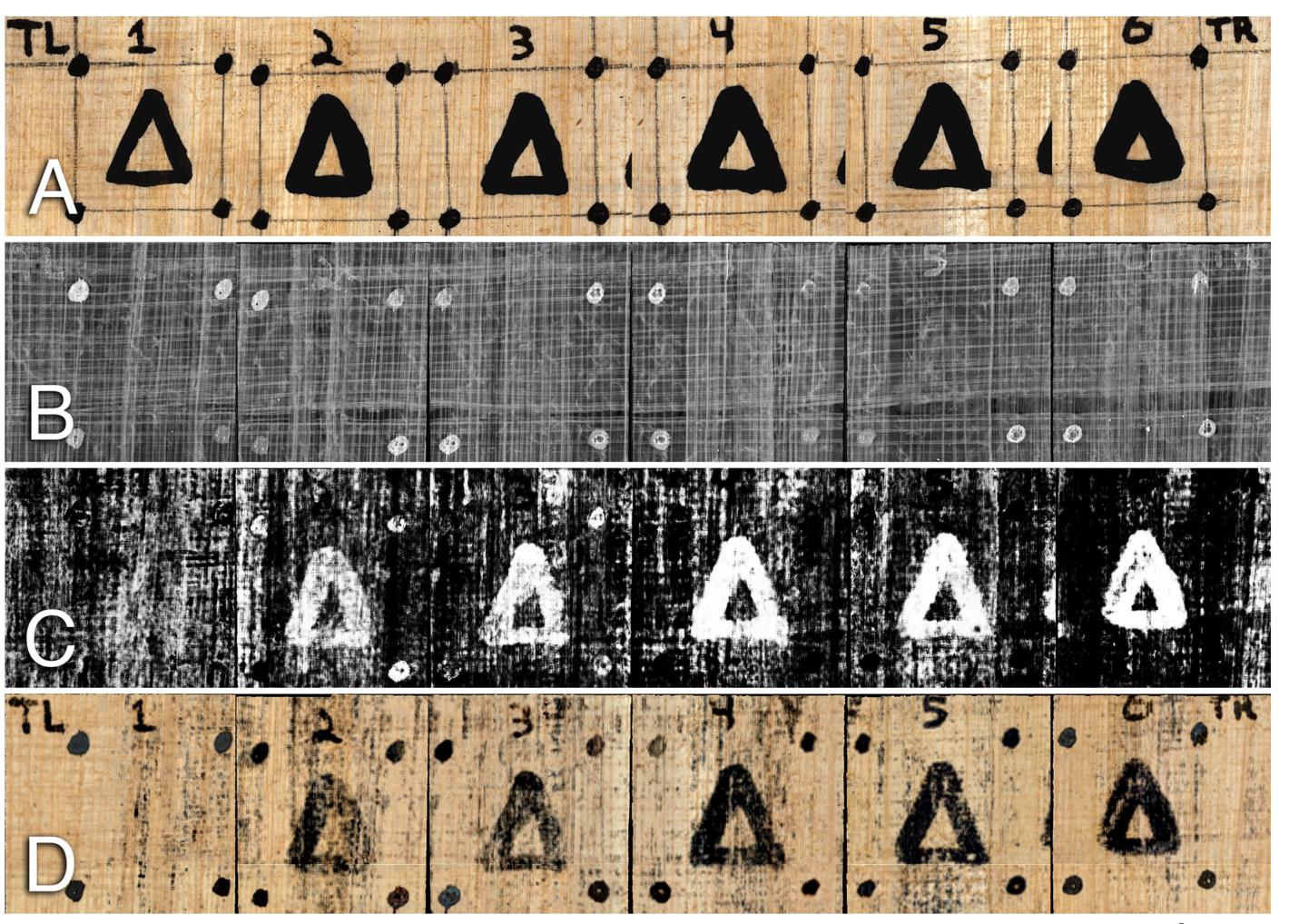




CNN used to detect ink and reconstruct images

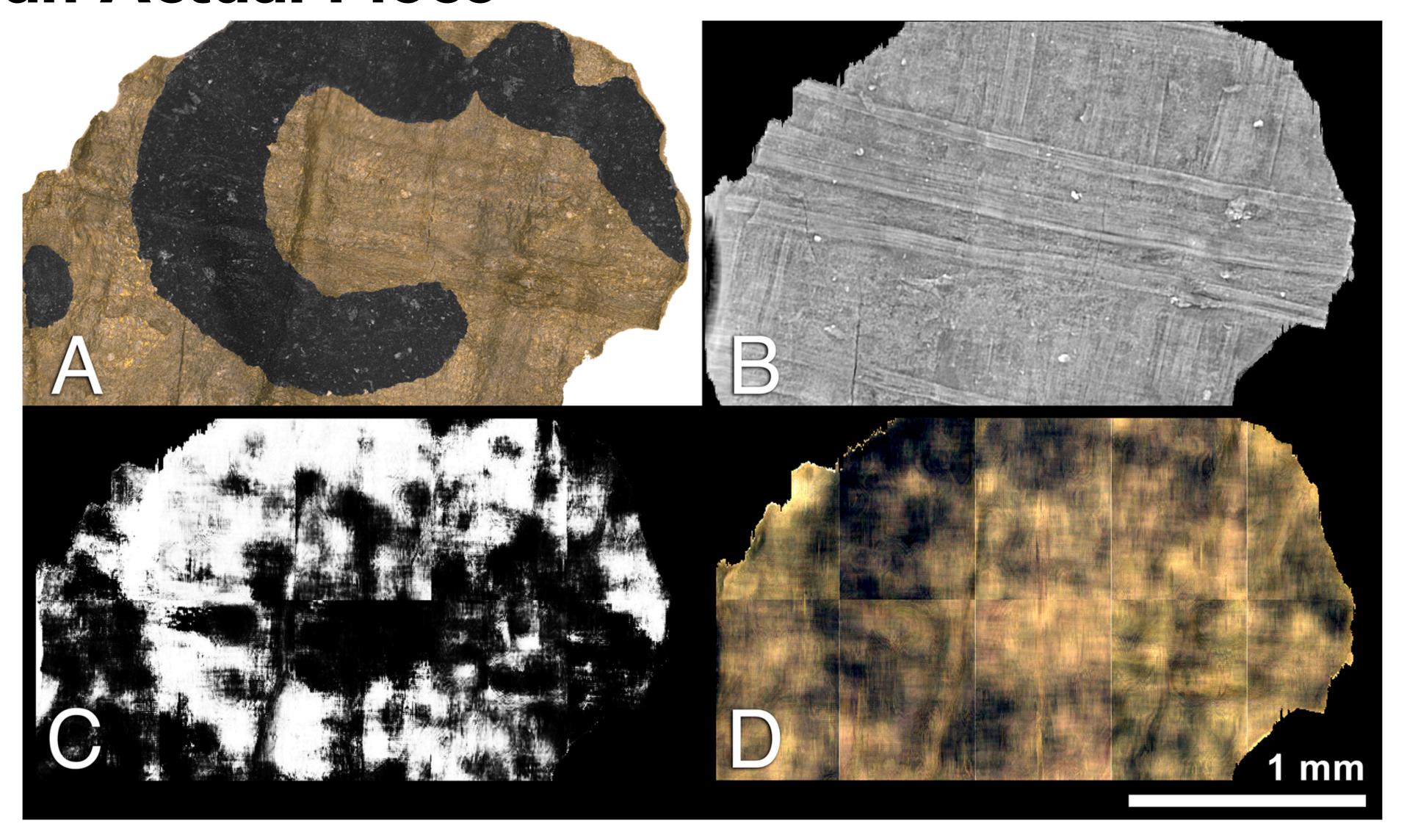

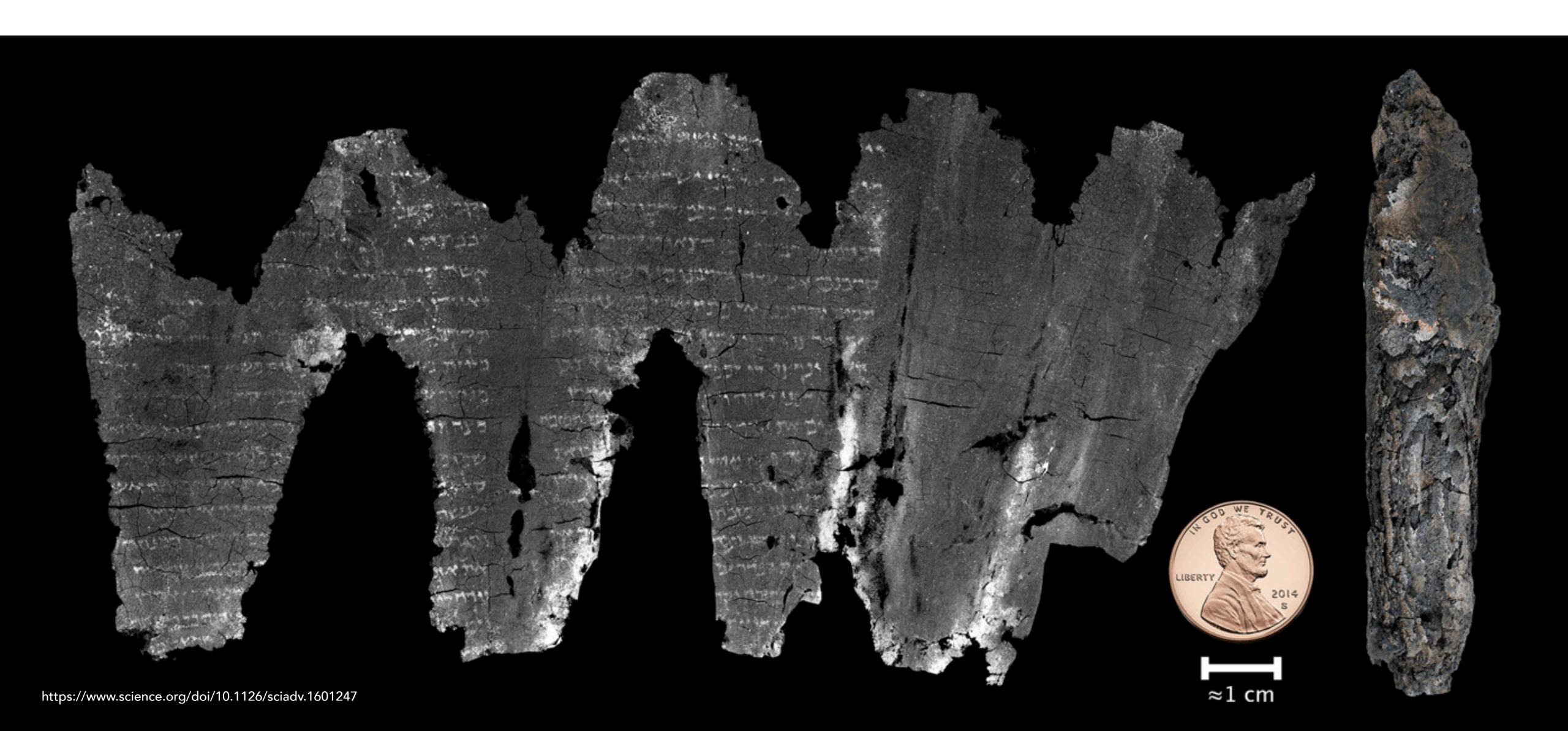
Results on an Actual Piece

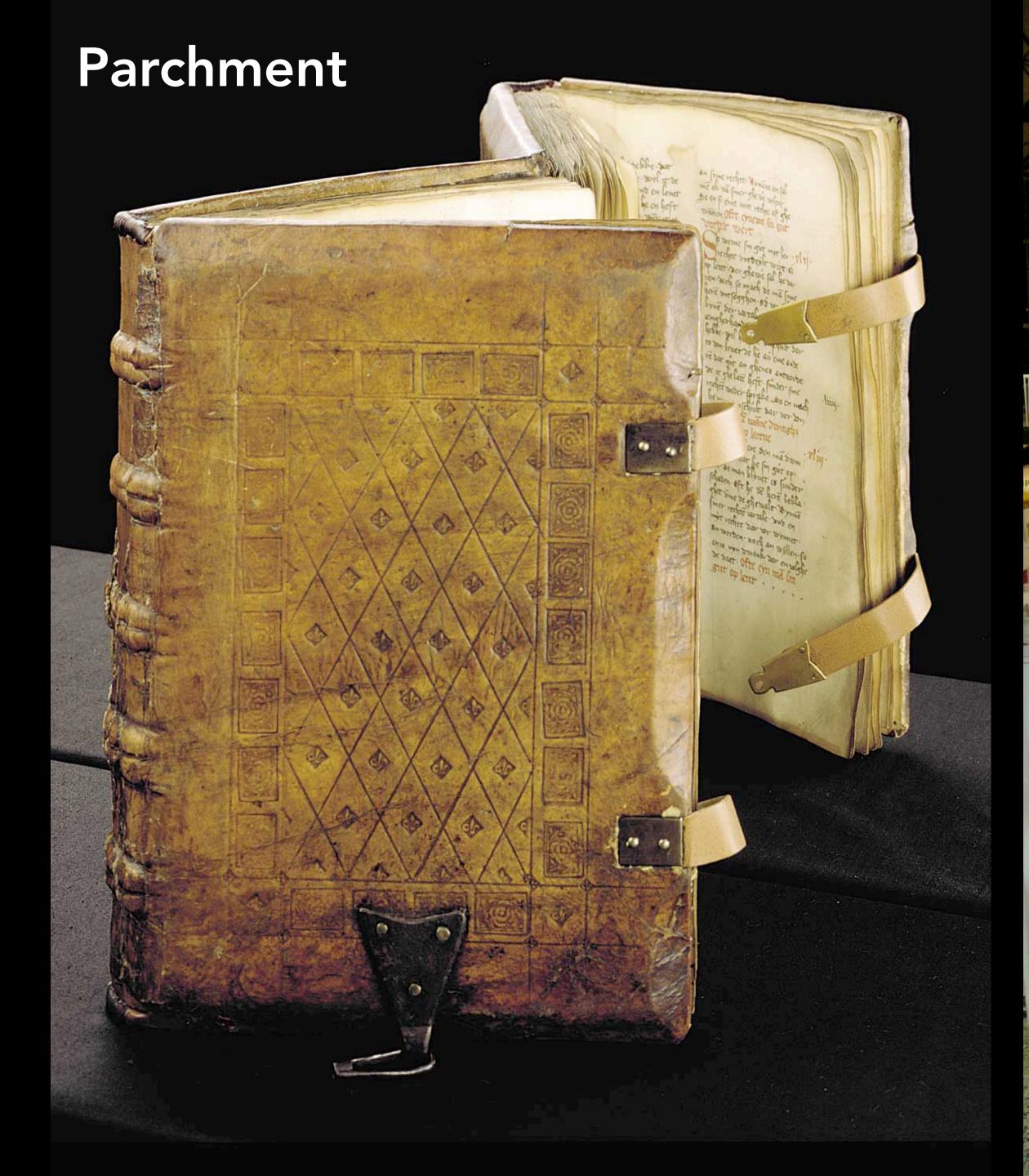

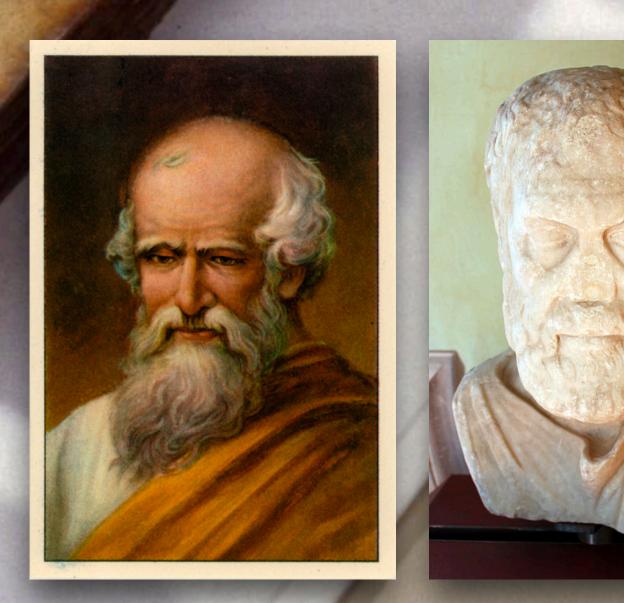




Medieval manuscript made from parchments used for other writings.

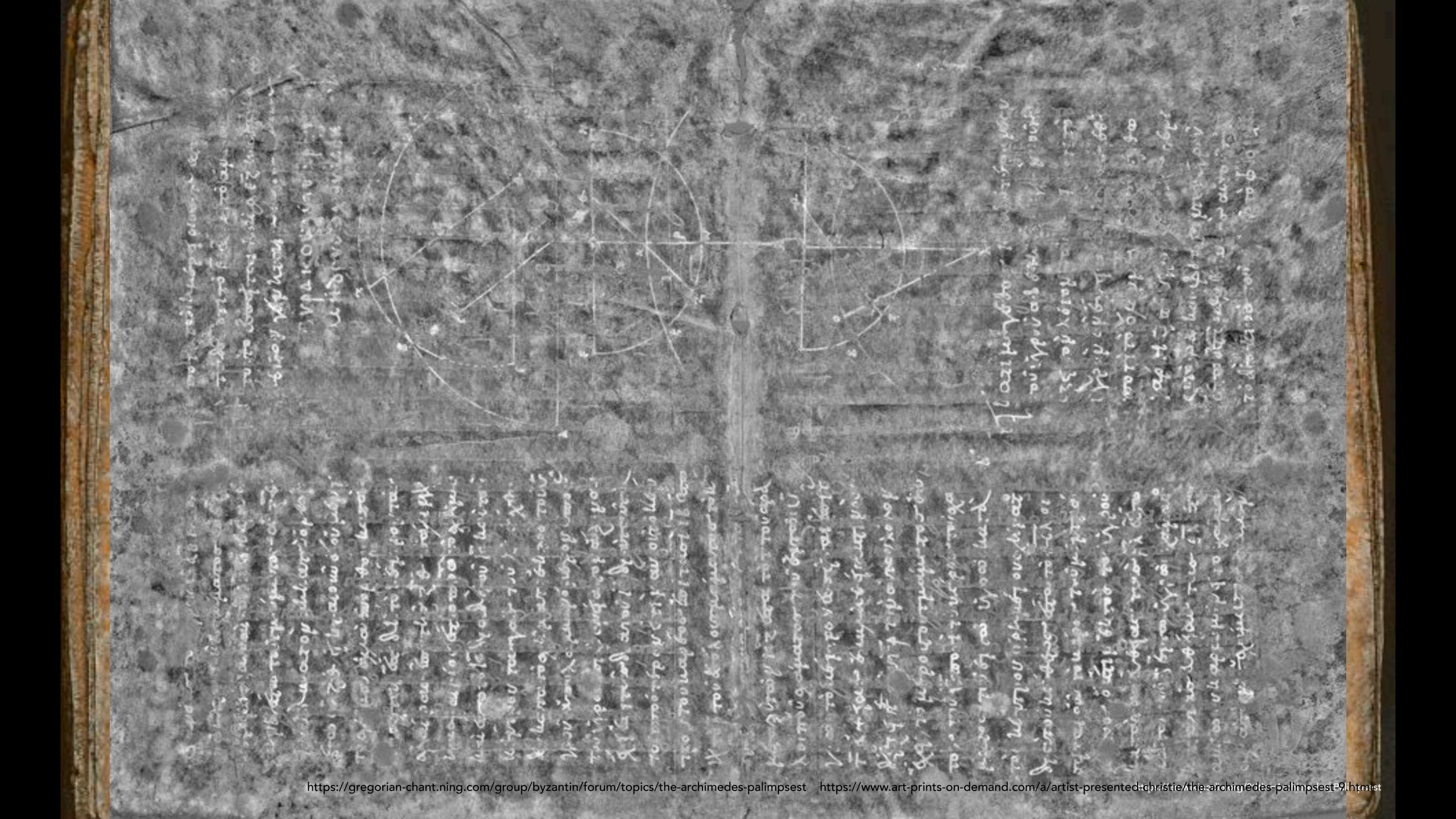
The over-text is a Byzantine prayerbook (1229).

The under-texts are mainly from Archimedes and Hyperides; some are unidentified.

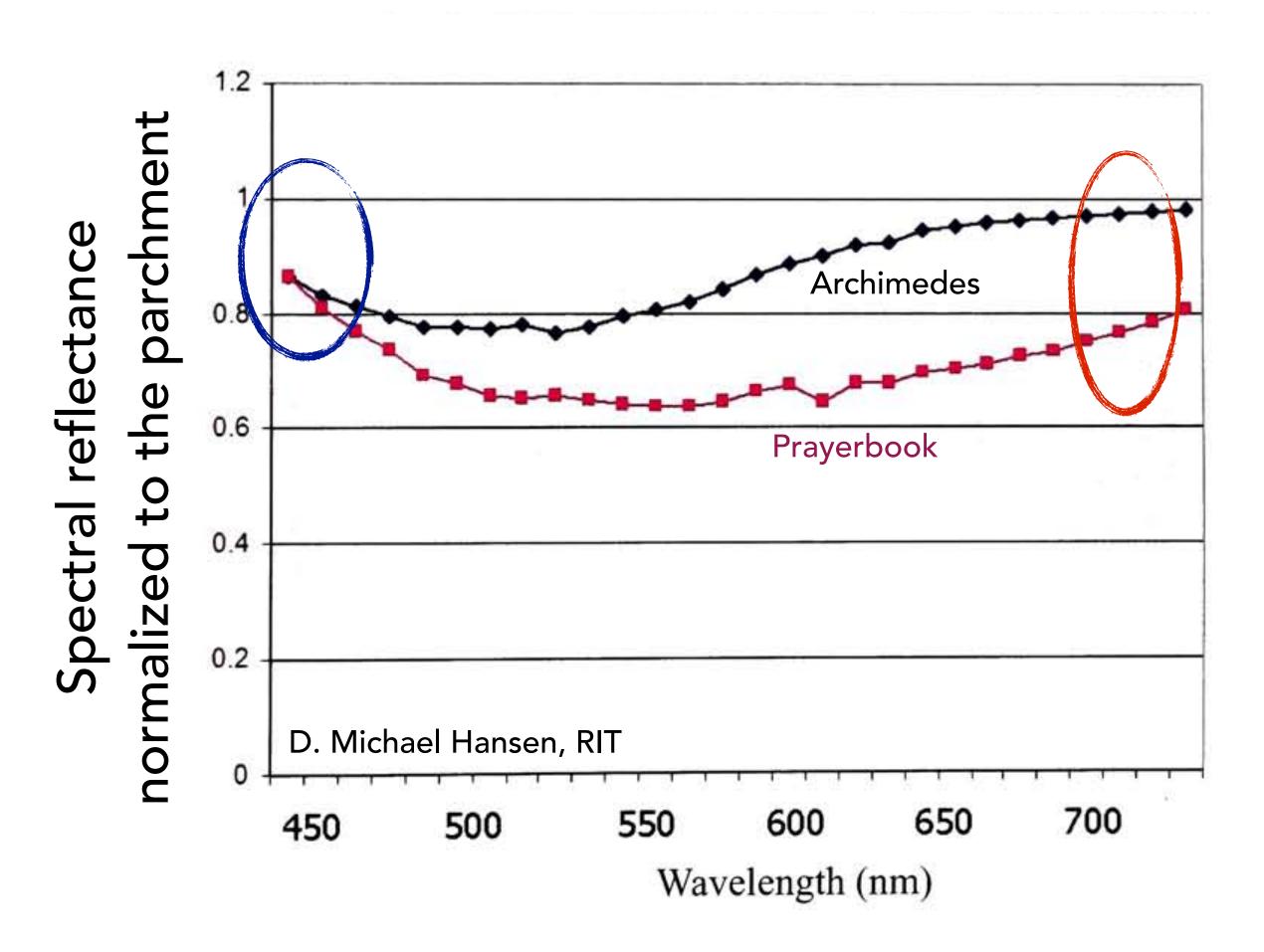


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Spectral Signatures

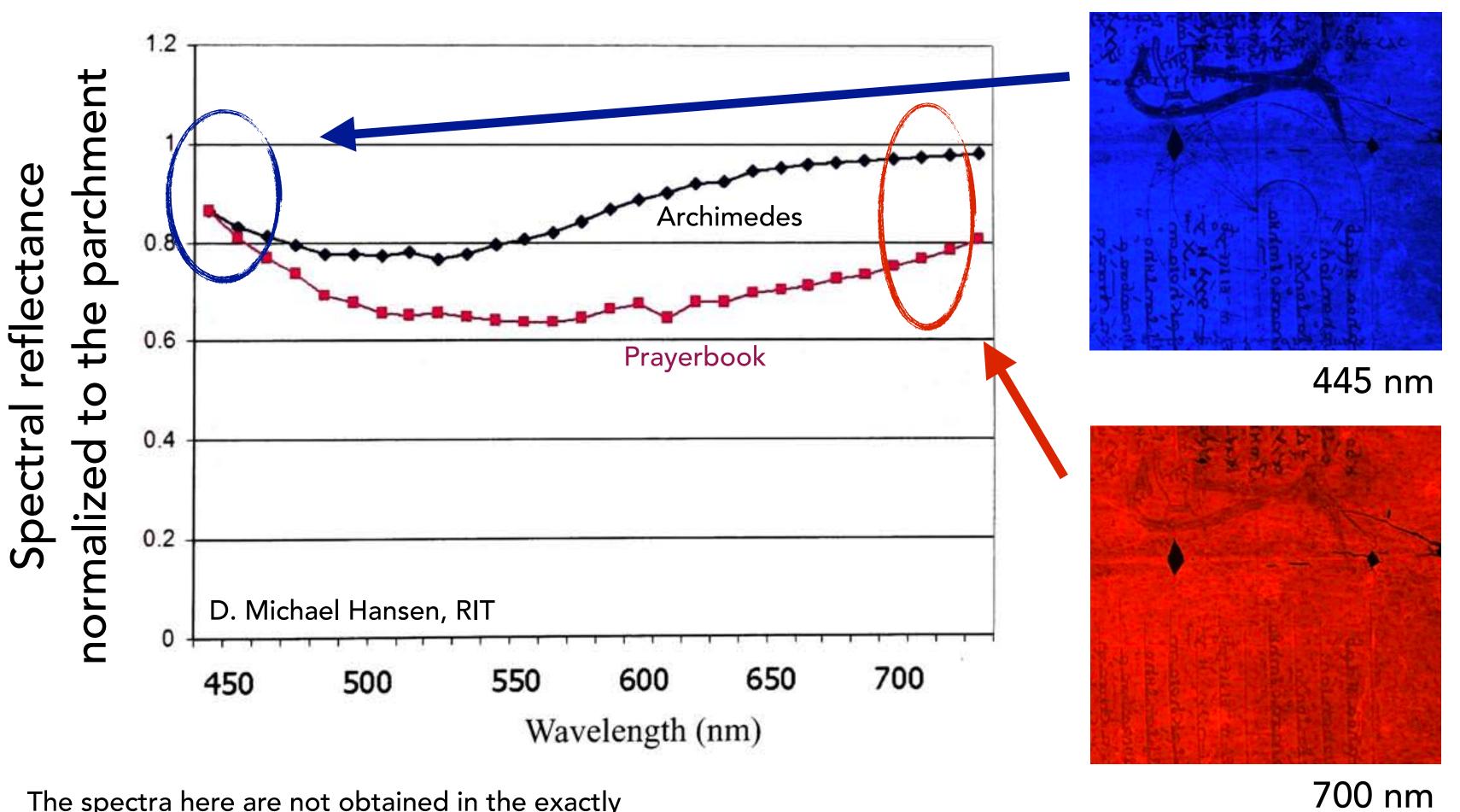


The key to read texts is to find contrast: b/t texts and parchment and b/t over & under texts.

- Texts reflectance is lower than that of parchment; they will look dark.
- If two points have the same reflectance, the one with higher concentration (abundance) will appear darker.

Spectral Signatures

Drawings are Archimedes (under-texts); vertical texts are Prayerbook (over-texts).



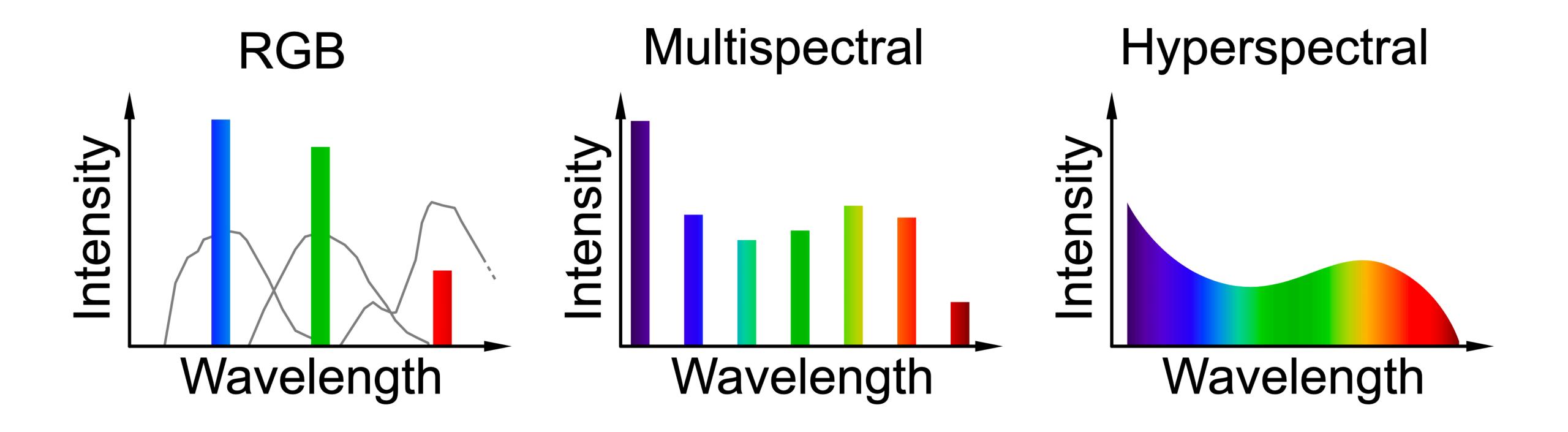
Over- and under-texts have similar reflectance, but under-texts have lower abundance (scratched!) so they look lighter than over-texts.

Both are different from the parchment, i.e., visible.

Under-texts reflectance is similar to that of the parchment so they are invisible. Over-texts are still somewhat visible.

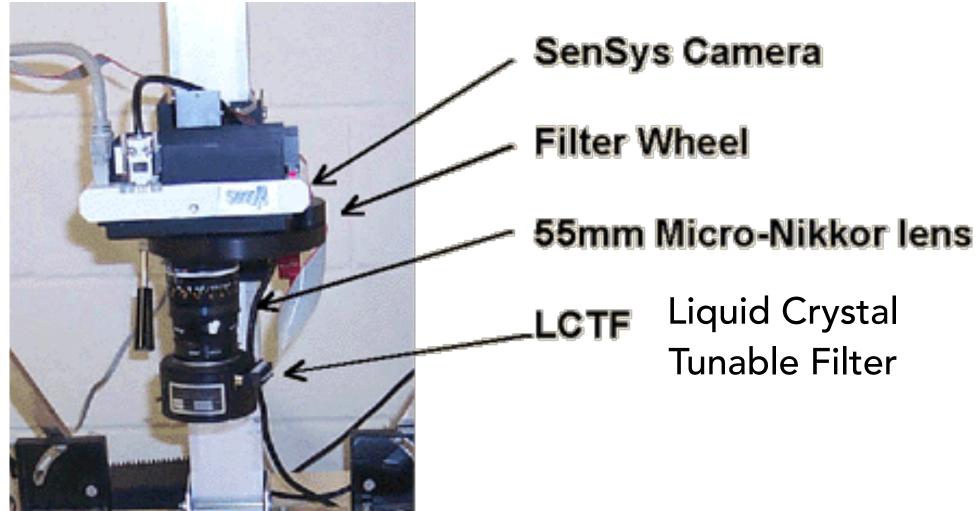
The spectra here are not obtained in the exactly same setup used to take the images on the right.

Initial Multispectral Imaging Device



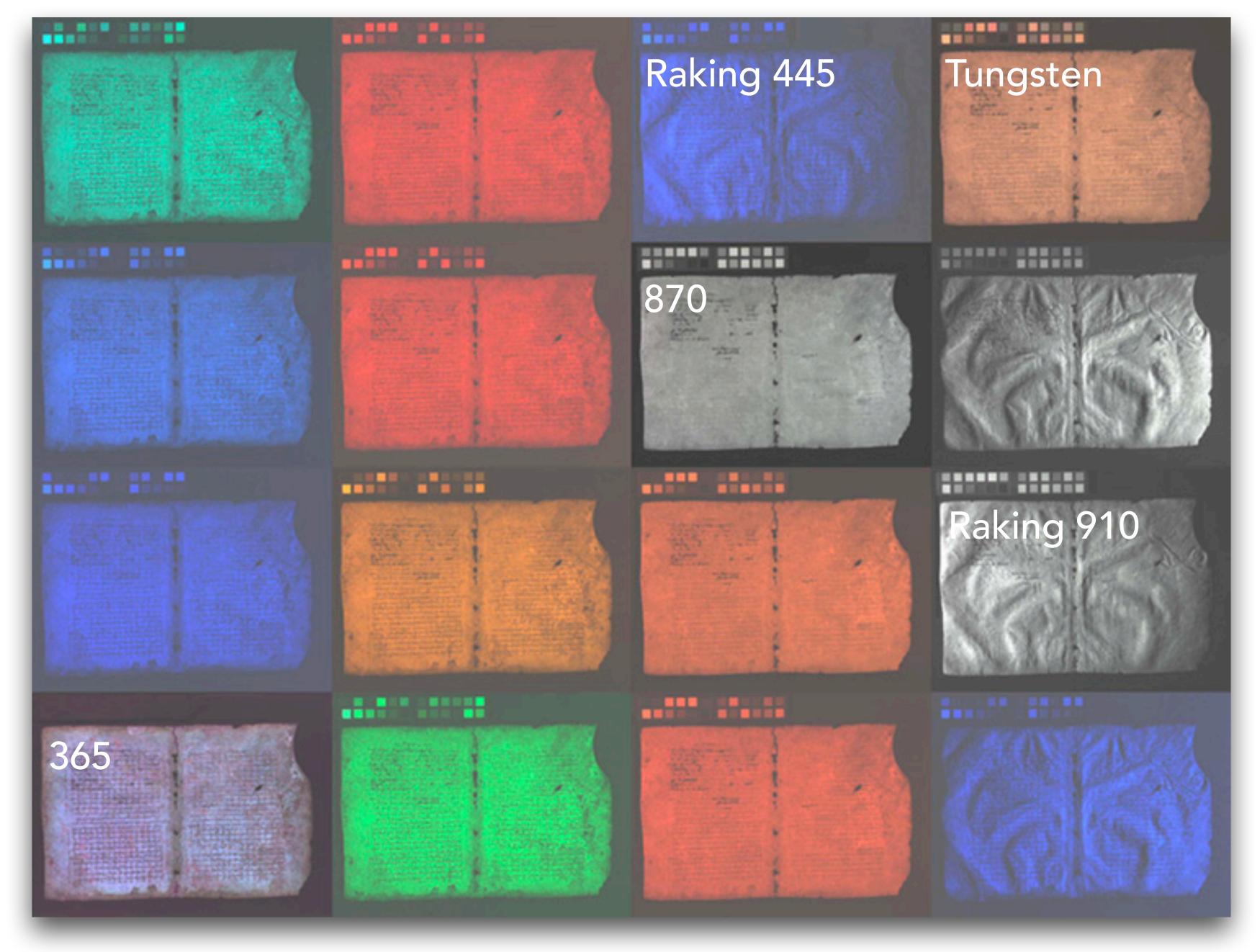


The filters used in the initial imaging are actually the standard astronomical UBVRI filters! They later also used XRF, too.

Data

Illuminations:

- 365 nm 870 nm (11)
 - 365 nm is longwave ultraviolet, which induces fluorescence
- 700 nm+ is NIR
- 1 broadband tungsten light illumination
- 2 raking illuminations
 - 445 nm and 910 nm
 - From both left and right
- X-ray fluorescence for some leaves (not shown here).

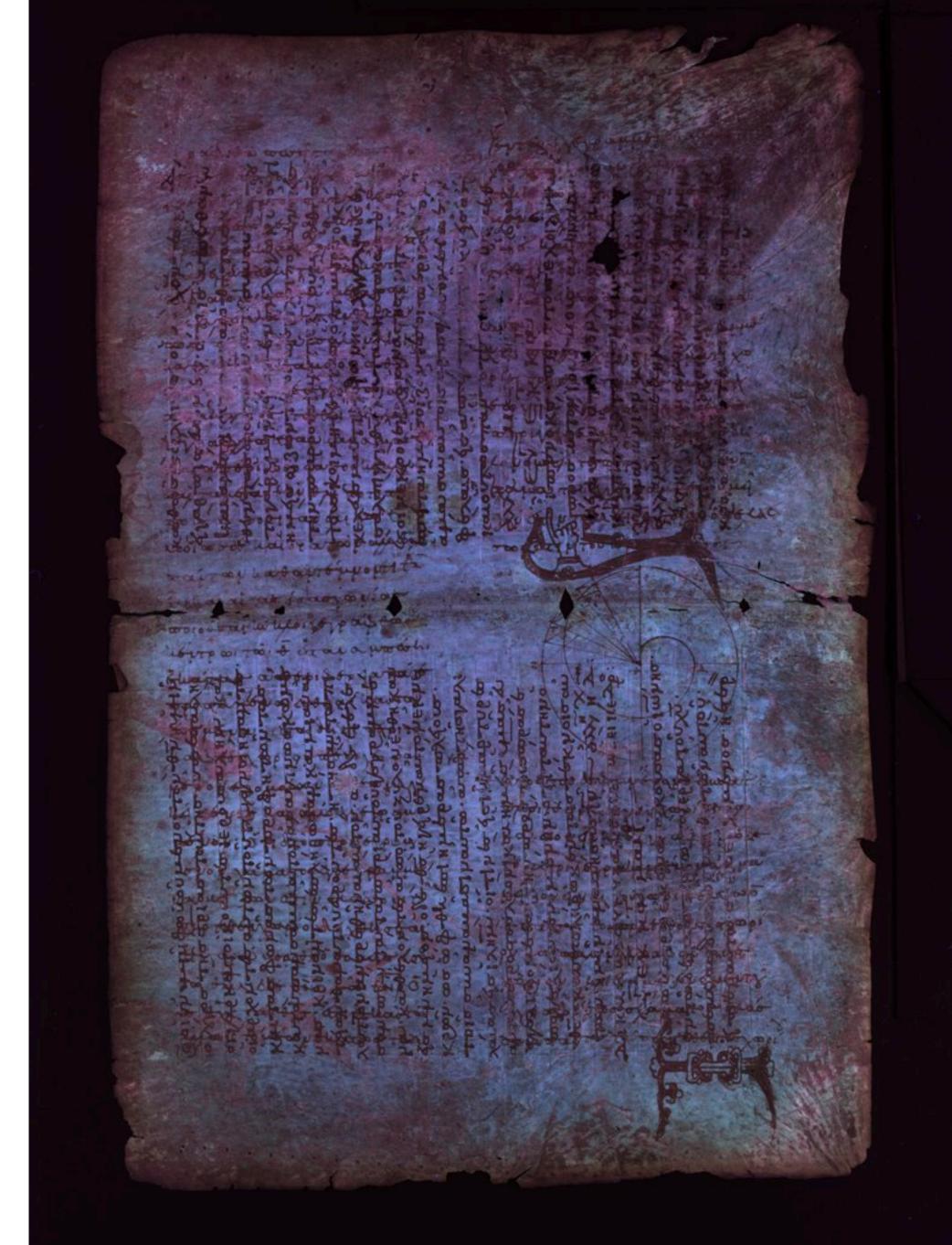


LWUV Fluorescence

365 nm (LWUV) imaging best distinguishes the texts (both under and over) from the parchment.

LWUV generates visible fluorescence. Both LWUV and the fluorescence are absorbed by the ink but not by the parchment.

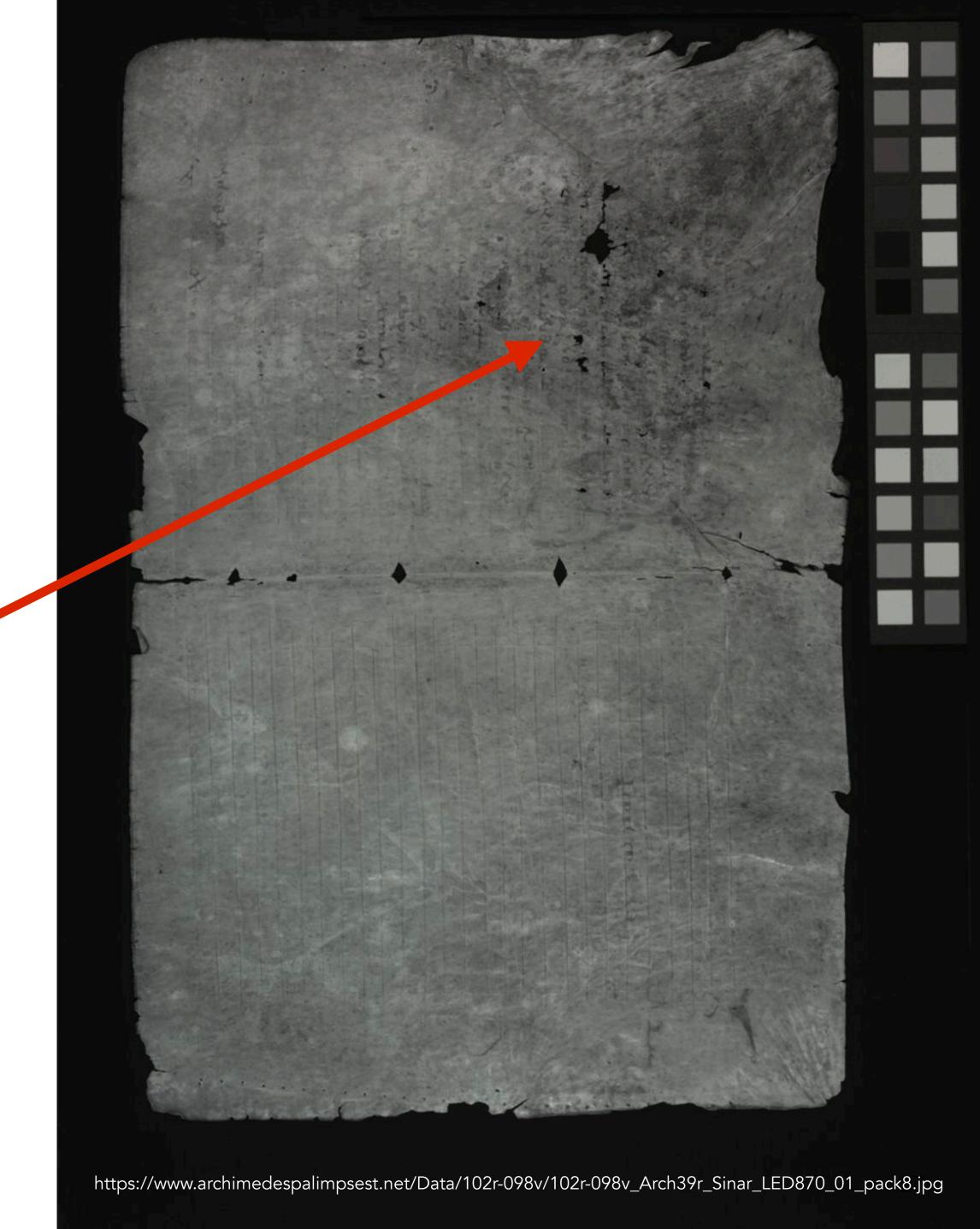

870 nm (NIR)

Very little text, both under and over, can be seen.

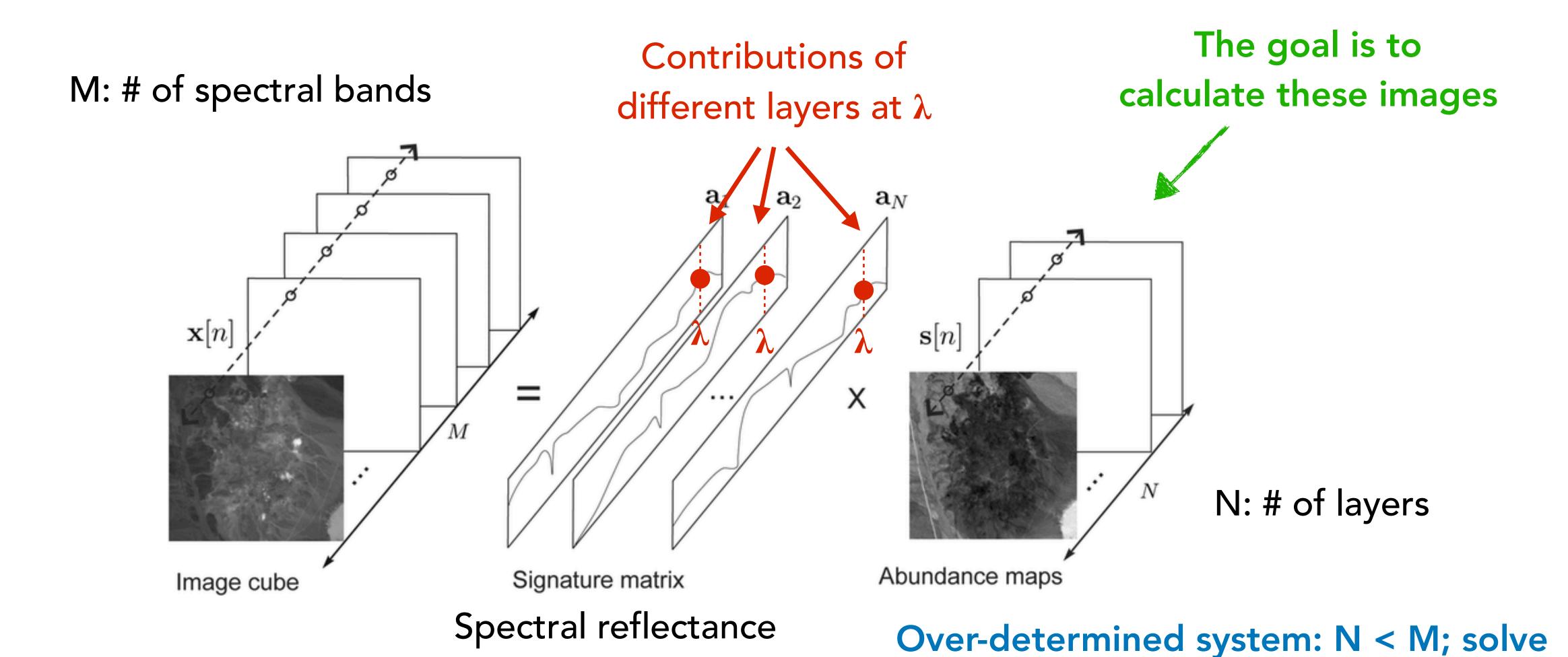
Presumably at 870 nm, the reflectances of the texts and the parchment are very similar.

• So texts will only be visible when the abundance is very high.



Linear Mixing Model (Originally Used in Remo)

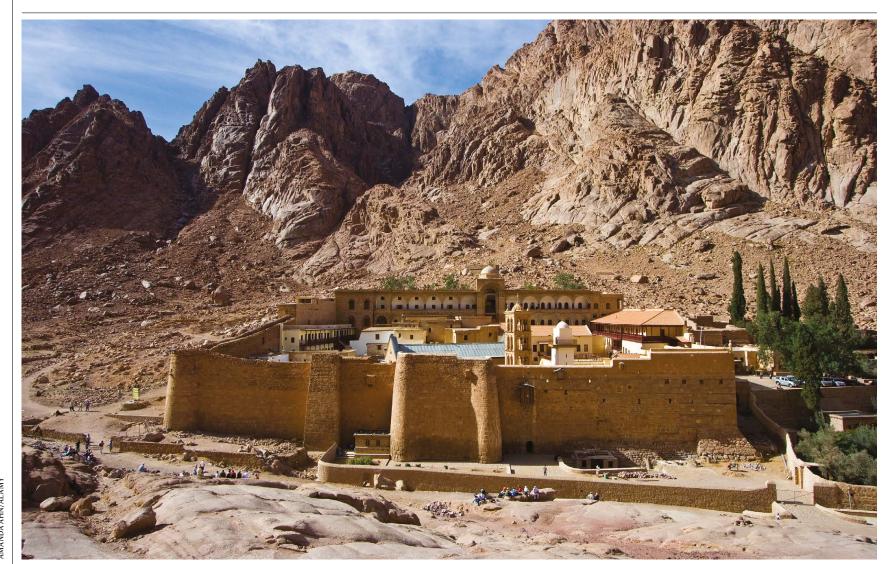

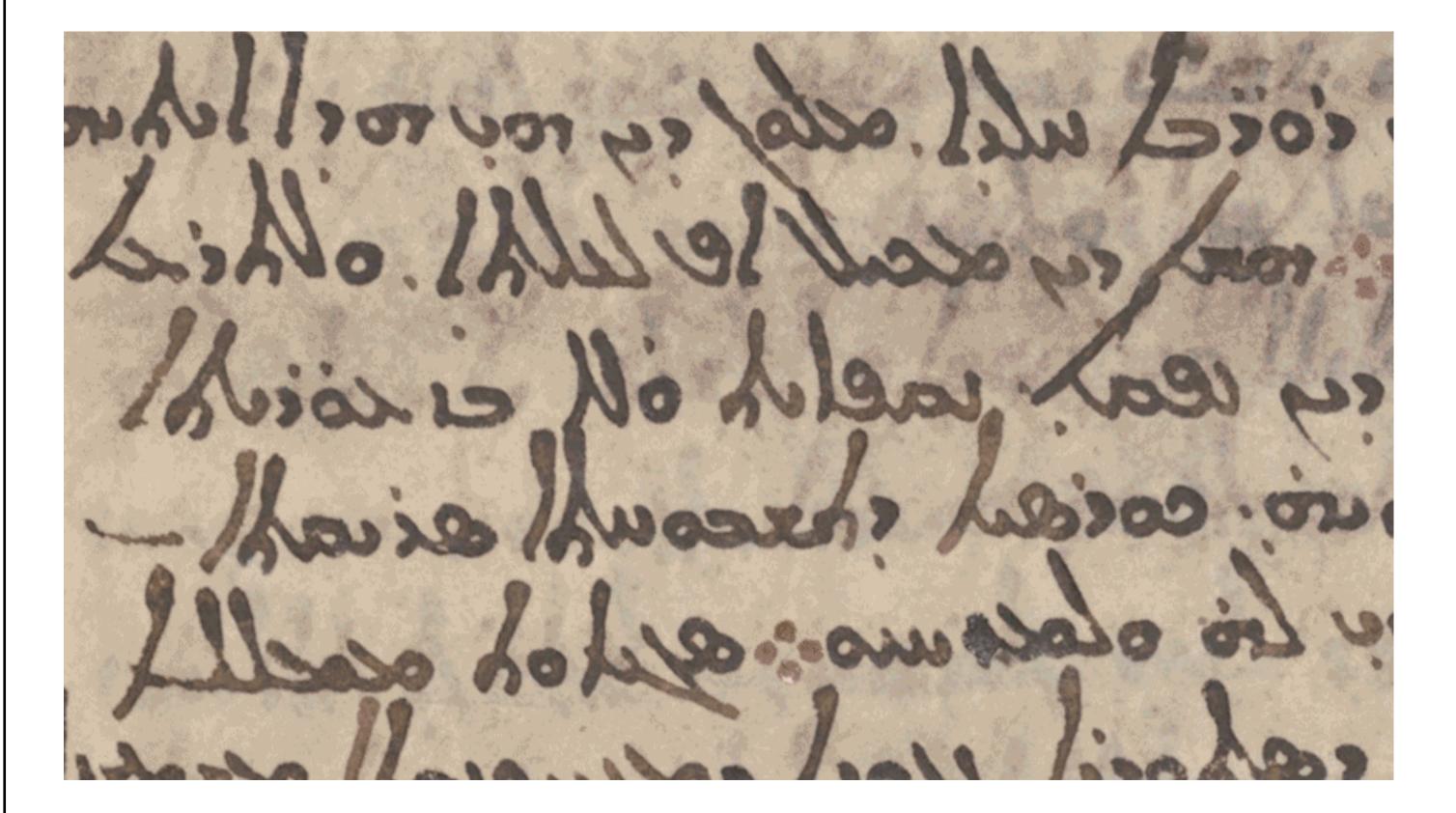

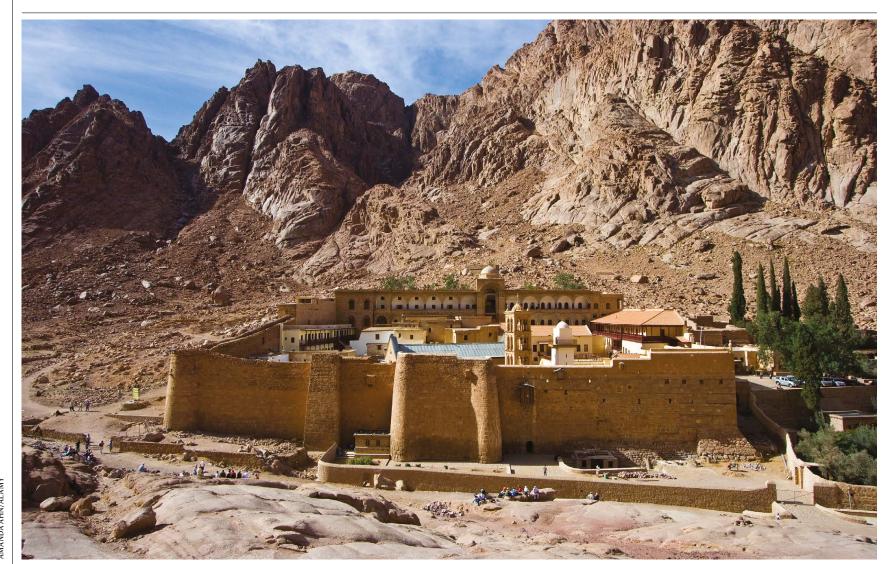
Hipparchus's Star Catalogue

Recently discovered; believed to be the long-lost, earliest mapping of the entire sky by Hipparchus. We imaged it using multi-spectral imaging and are working on revealing the hidden texts.



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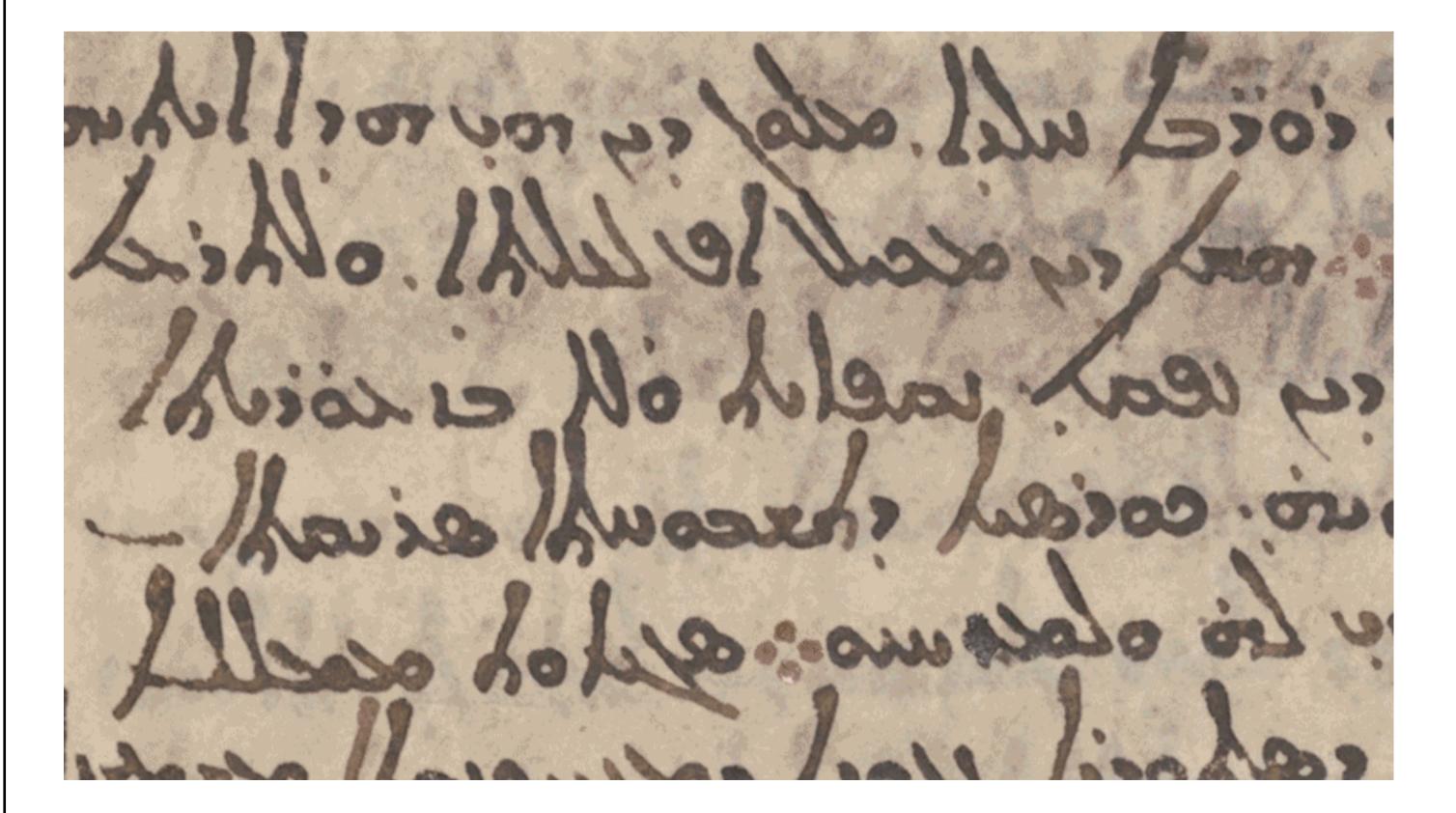
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Pentimento

The presence/emergence of earlier paints that have been painted over.

- Painter changing mind (pentimento is from "pentirsi" in Italian, which means repentance)
- Underdrawing

Can be identified using imaging techniques (e.g., X-ray), or from paint composition changes (previous slide).

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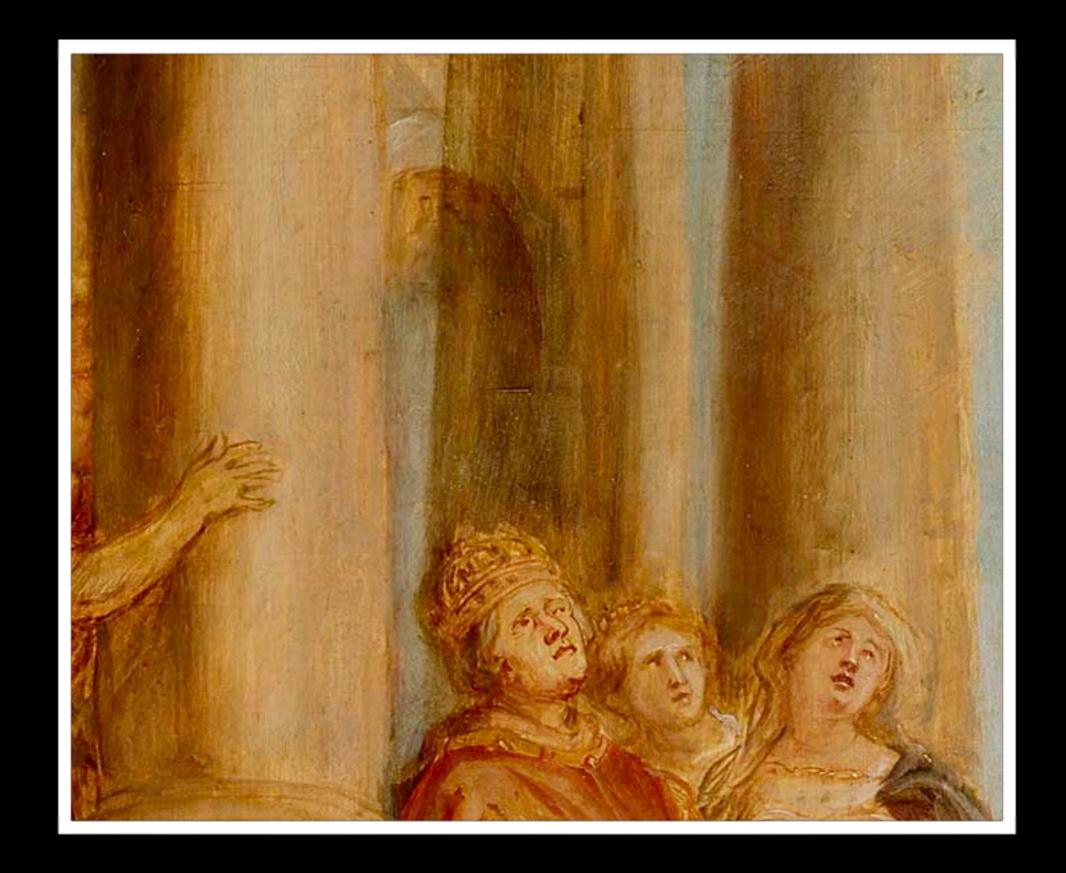
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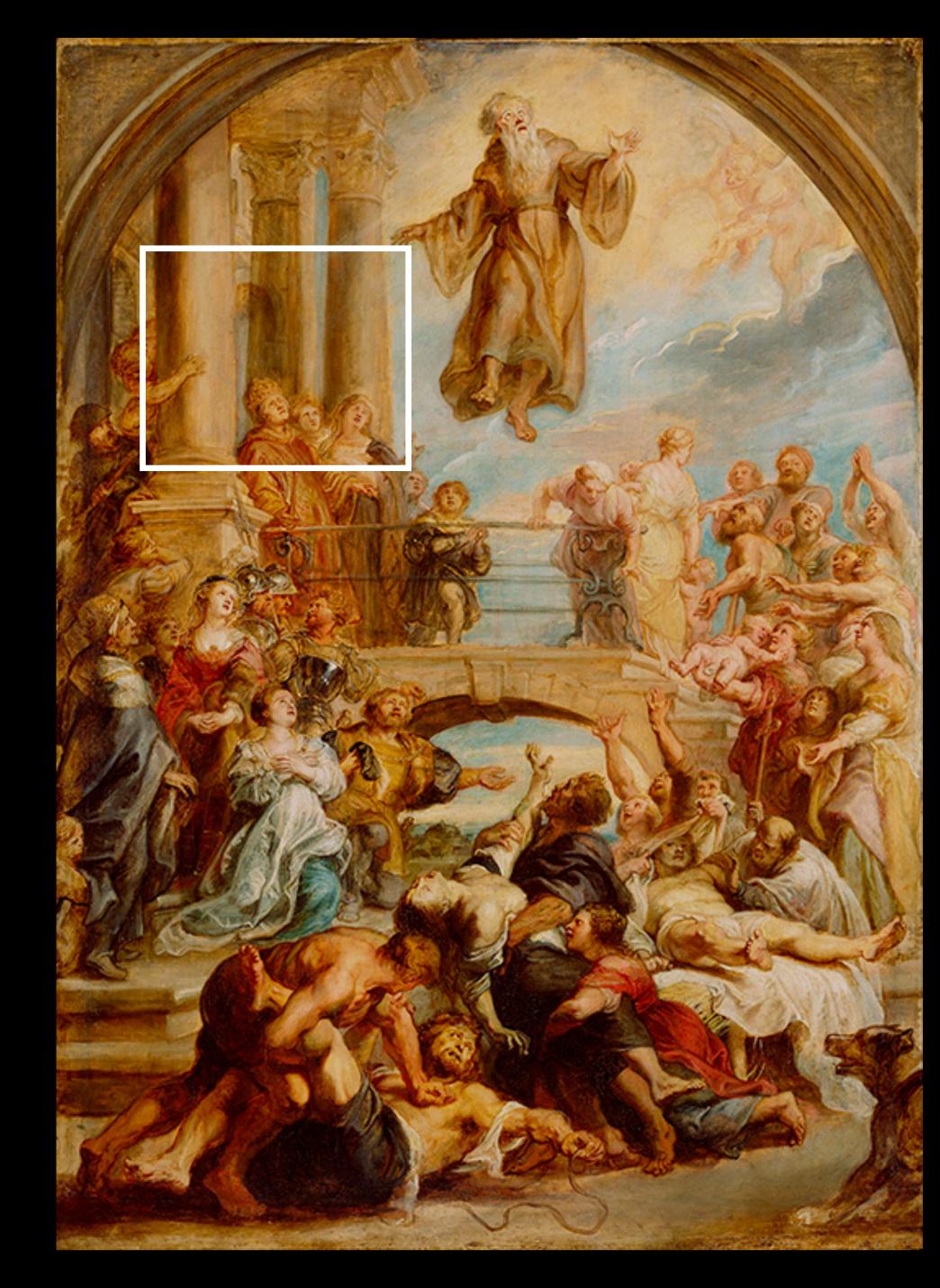

The Miracles of Saint Francis of Paola, P. P. Rubens, 1627–8. J. Paul Getty Museum.



The refractive index of the linseed oil in the paint increases over time and matches that of the pigment. The paint layer becomes transparent, revealing the pentimento underneath.



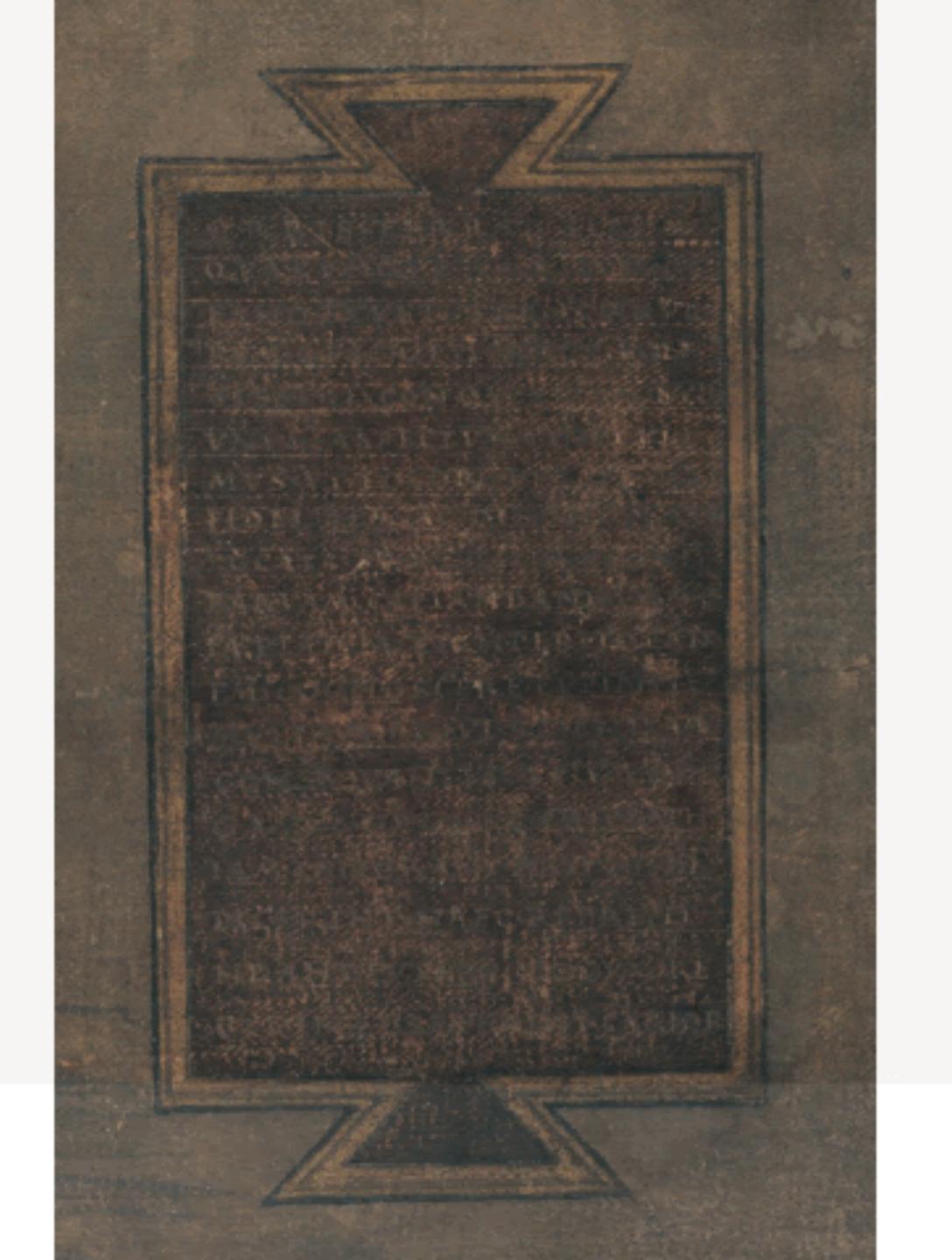

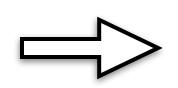


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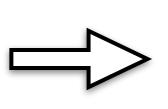


Recall: Photogrammetry (Structure from Motion)

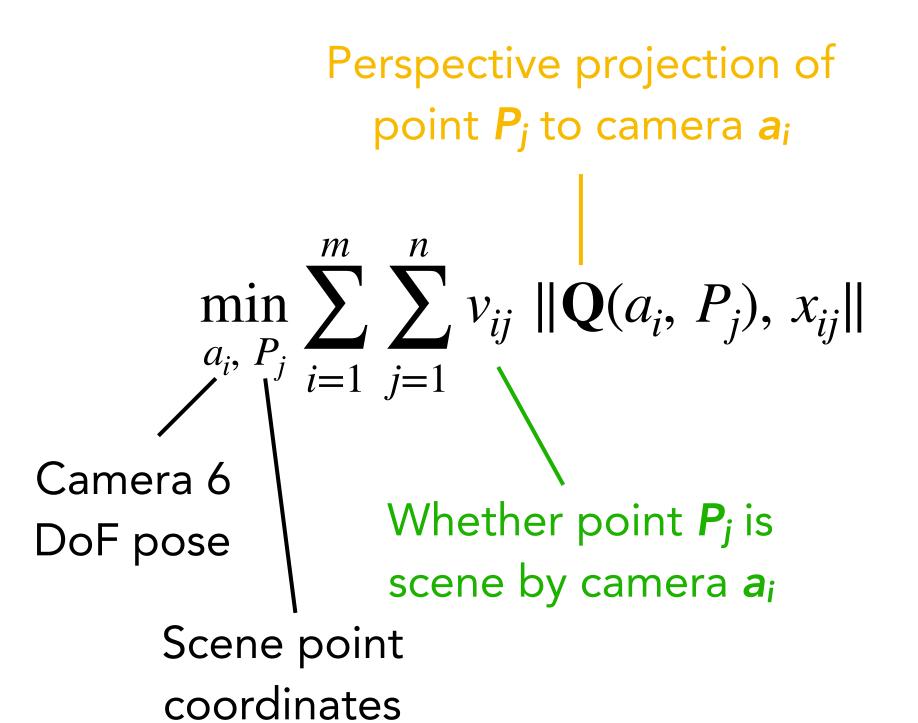
Take many photos of the scene (in theory from any arbitrary positions)

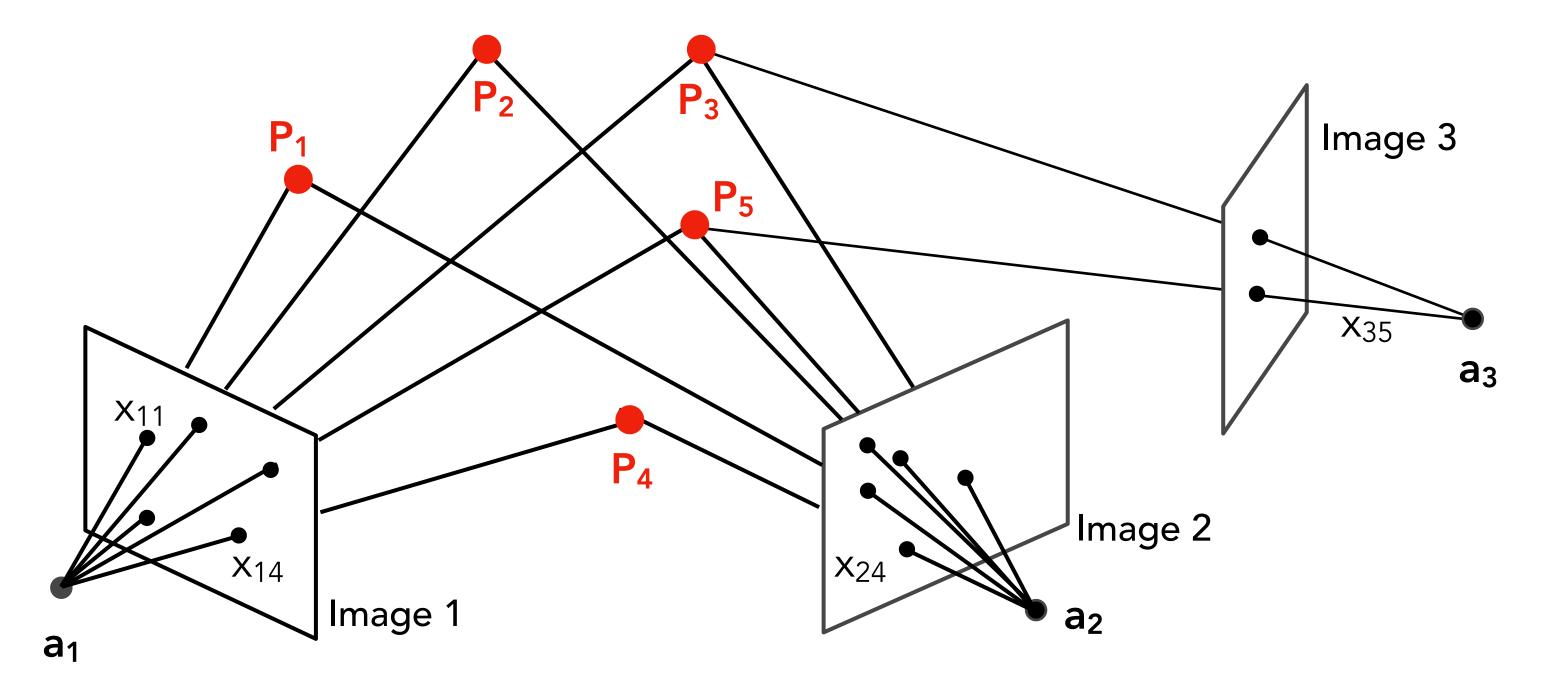


Align photos
(calculating matching pixels across photos)

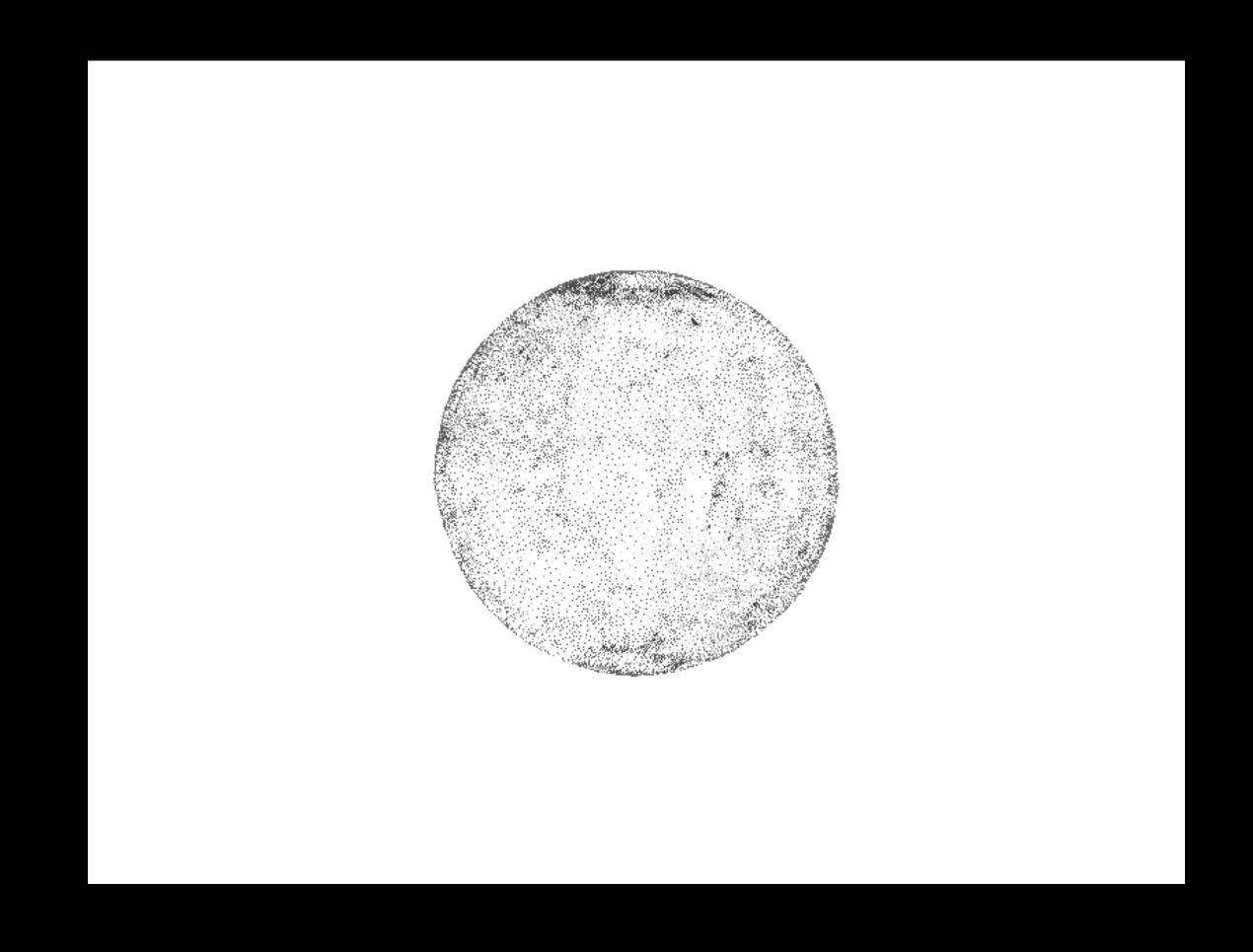


Bundle Adjustment: find the best-fit camera pose and scene point positions





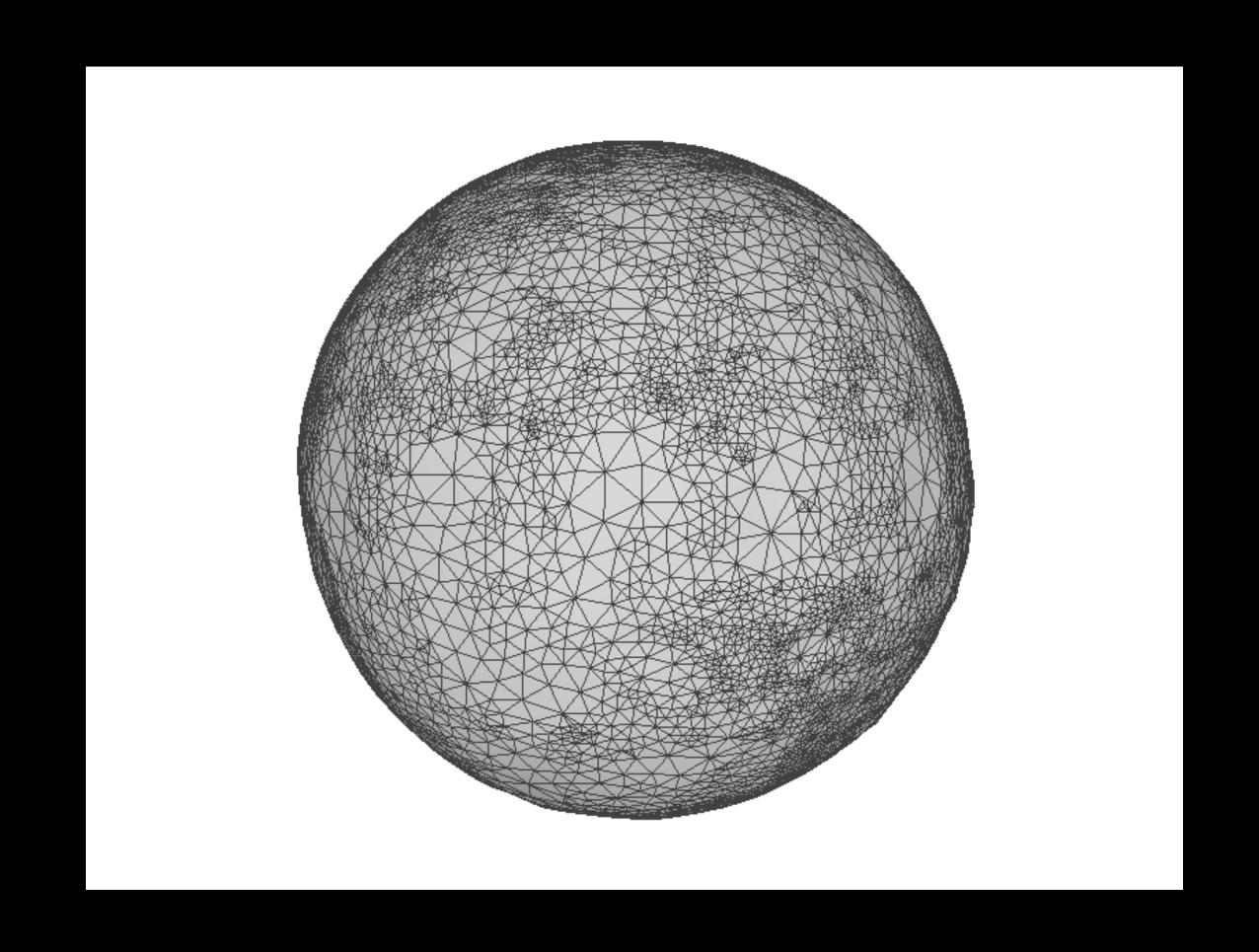
Point Cloud from SfM



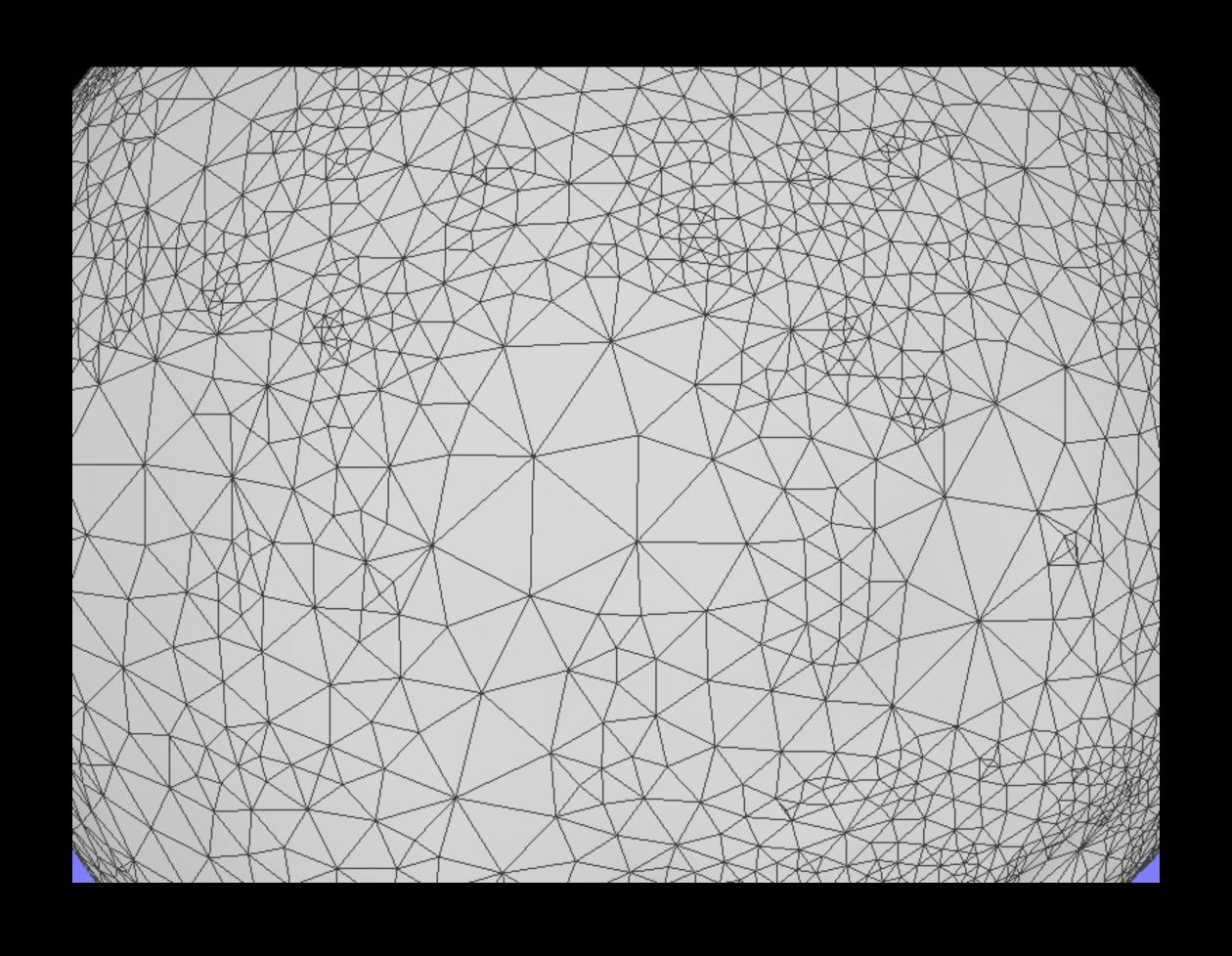
