4.2 (due Mar 4, 2008) Implement the simplex algorithm with random pivot rule. Your implementation should use exact arithmetic (using GMP).

To test your program generate an $n \times n$ matrix A with independently random entries, $P(a_{ij} = 1) = P(a_{ij} = -1) = 1/2$; and then consider the following linear program

$$\min \sum_{i=1}^{n} \sum_{j=1}^{n} z_{ij}$$
$$z_{ij} \ge a_{ij} - x_i - y_j \quad (\text{for } i, j \in [n]),$$
$$z_{ij} \ge -a_{ij} + x_i + y_j \quad (\text{for } i, j \in [n])$$

Run your program for n = 1, ..., 20, take average of the objective over 50 runs for each value of n and plot the function.

How large value of n can your program handle? n = 100? n = 200?
